Newsletter & Commission Report October 2016

PERSONNEL:

- In August I handed out the information on "Unjust Enrichment" as it relates to recovery of expenses associated with educating an employee who leaves. I need to know if the commission is interested in pursuing this or removing it from discussion. If interested, an instruction would need to be given to the States Attorney to file the suit.
- I have six applicants for the open deputy sheriff position which closes on October 31. I am in the process of researching the employment polygraph option (DCI) and also the psychological examination process (Community Counseling). I hope to have an answer on cost very soon.
 - The position has been open since September 1. Our application number is very poor.
 - I hope to conduct interviews in November and narrow down the list for polygraph and psychological testing.
- Steve Flanagan began his employment on August 16th and he is being "baptized by fire" with exposure to various calls for service.
- Tala Sandness was formally appointed and took her oath of office in September and worked a few short shifts during August and October. She is currently in the orientation phase learning more about the county and the office and our operations.

TRAINING:

- Deputy Flanagan and PT Deputy Sandness each completed firearms qualification in October.
- I was not able to attend the fall Sheriff's Conference due to manpower and workload issues.
- Deputy Flanagan and PT Deputy Sandness each will be doing the Incident Command Systems series independent study online and each will be taking the Terminal Operator course so they can be qualified to operate the teletype computer in compliance with Federal code and rules.
- We will have mental health training (now required), annual Taser training and RADAR operator instruction to anyone who needs it.

EQUIPMENT:

- I ordered the new patrol vehicle from Lamb's in Onida. There does not appear to be an issue with the budget since we are an entire person short. I don't expect that to change. I will be ordering some of the accessories for the vehicle prior to its arrival. One being the prisoner cage which costs between \$600 and \$1200 dollars which would be from the jail budget. The cage is a liability control issue we have avoided in years past but shouldn't overlook anymore. I would spending authority to seek out quotes and purchase the partition.
- I did not place anything on the surplus list because most of what I have could either be donated to other public safety agencies or discarded. I will be processing this in the coming months.
- I have spoken to the Assessor and Highway Superintendant about moving our 2008 Chevy Trailblazer (white) to the Assessor to replace the 2005 GMC Yukon. The Assessor test drove it and believes it will suit their (and others who may need it) needs. That brings up the disposition of the 2005 Yukon. The highway department has expressed an interest in taking it to use when a pickup would not be needed and thus allow the employees to use the recently purchased Dodge

pickup for their chores. I am asking that approve the transfer of the 2008 Trailblazer to the Assessor and the 2005 Yukon to the highway department for operations and insurance purposes.

GRANTS

- 2015-2016 Highway Safety Grant: This grant is now closed.
- **2016-2017 Highway Safety Grant**: We were again approved for this program. It pays a deputies overtime wage to perform highway safety related functions. Our expenses represent the match needed to complete the program. The goal of this grant is to reduce accidents (non-injury, injury and fatality) through speed enforcement, high visibility, and impaired driving detection and apprehension.
- Bullet Proof Partnership Grant: Not current open for applications.

IMPORTANT ACTIVITIES:

My **YEAR TO DATE** activity report is attached to this newsletter. This information is also uploaded to the sheriff's page on the Hand County Website. It can be reviewed at any time.

OM Kendrick set up and administered the prescription drug "take back" program. This program allows people to turn in unused prescriptions for disposal. We then shipped the roughly 140 pounds of drugs to the DEA via Fed-Ex for ultimate disposal. This was a trail run for us and it is worthwhile so we will do it again in the future. Next time we will be able to advertise it better and more in advance!

In cooperation with the city police department, the city, county and state highway departments and the states attorney's office I created an annesty program to recover road signs which had been stolen or misplaced. This program is two weeks old and has two weeks to go. So far I am aware of only one sign being turned in. The last estimated cost of a standard road sign was \$100.
