# **PERSONNEL:**

- Roxy Peck resigned without two weeks' notice on September 25. This leaves this position open and opens a discussion on what we will do next.
- There are still no suitable leads on the office manager's position.
- Deputy Koster tested with Law Enforcement Training (LET) in Pierre and passed the reciprocity test. He then returned to LET and two required segments which included firearms, use of force and emergency vehicle operations and passed them. For all practical purposes, he is not certified with the state of South Dakota and only needs to have the LET Commission approve his credentials. This will likely happen at the next LET Commission meeting. Once Koster is certified he would advance in the wage scale and receive an additional \$1/hour step increase. He is also approaching his 6 month county probationary period and if taken off probation would receive an additional \$0.50/hour step increase.
- I still have a disciplinary issue which needs to be addressed. I would like to do in executive session.
- Aaron Meyer moved to the Hills Area in the spring but never formally resigned his appointment and employment as a part-time deputy. I recently received his resignation and will file it with the Auditor's Office.

# **TRAINING:**

- I did not attend the annual ND/SD Sheriff's Conference and Training. I did, however attend the Office of Highway Safety grant preparation training on October 1 in Aberdeen.
- Deputy Larson and I have been working through various orientation items.

# Newsletter & Commission Report October - 2015

#### **EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT & 911 REPORT**

- Jennifer Sietsema from NECOG came on September 4, 2015. She went through the final Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) document before she types the final copy up. She expects to be done within the month of October.
- The EMF's for FFY2016 have been signed and sent. All have been accepted and copies returned for our records.
- NIMS / ICS training: Are there any changes to report from the County Commission or department heads?
- I attended the SDEMA annual conference September 14 17, 2015. I found the conference to be very informational with the classes, tabletop exercises and meetings that were given. It also gave me a chance to meet more Emergency Managers from around the state along with putting names with faces that are in the SDOEM office that I have talked with on several occasions over the phone.
- Deputy Koster and I attended the South Dakota Law Enforcement NCIC Limited Access class held in Pierre at the Law Enforcement Academy. This class consisted of a 4 hour training course and final to become a Terminal Operator in South Dakota. I am now certified to use the Omnixx program which is a program used by the state, national and international law enforcement agencies for investigative purposes.

#### **TRAINING**

- During the month of September I have completed the following training/orientation or inservice:
  - ICS 800 On-line course
  - Terminal Operator NCIC Limited Access Class
  - o G202: Debris Management Class
  - o 2015 SDEMA Conference
- In the month of October, I will expand and dig deeper into all issues above plus:
  - Continue to get credentialing paperwork done for the Fire Departments, EMT's, City and County employees and Hospital employees.
  - o I will be meeting with Patti Pudwill to go over more training in the SLA book and paperwork that will be due by the middle of the month.
  - I will be meeting with Bob Winsell to go over the Haz-Mat Mitigation Plan and funding that will be coming available for the FFY2016.
  - o Continuing updating information for contact list.

# **EQUIPMENT**

- The EM vehicle is basically done, only a few things remain to be worked on. It was taken to the SDEMA conference in Mitchell and I have pulled the enclosed mini-trailer, mobile command center (RV) and the portable generator behind it to get used to how it drove with the extra weight and length attached to it. I can say that it pulls all of our equipment without any problems.
- Sheriff DeBoer and I are continuing to work on bringing the computers, software and other technology up to date.
- I will be continuing to exercise the portable generators that are stored at the Weed and Pest Shop along with the generator at the Fire Hall.

#### **GRANTS**

- I am continuing to learn about the State & Local Agreement (SLA) funding grant which pays part of my wage/benefits and operational expenses.
- I am learning about the Hazard Mitigation grant program which helps mitigate disaster sites through capital improvement.

# **ACTIVITIES**

• During September, I responded either in part or individually to 1 assignment apart from training, orientation or staff development. I also have started a schedule for exercising the portable generator with the Fire Department to get many people as possible trained onto how to work it. I am also working with Brent Hovland, Hyde County Emergency Manager, to get a time worked out for the Highmore Fire Department to come and train with us.
