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RESOLUTION 2022-08 ESTABLISHES ELECTION PRECINCTS AND POLLING PLACES

WHEREAS, Hand County Resolution 2022-01 established new boundaries for each of the county's five commissioners, and

WHEREAS, as a result of the new commission districts, the most efficient means to conduct elections is by reducing the number of precincts from 12 to 5 and assigning each a polling place, and

WHEREAS, SDCL 12-14-1 requires the commissioners to establish by resolution the election precincts and designate the polling places within such precincts, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the following commissioner districts shall have the following polling places, to wit:

Commissioner District 1 includes the townships of Plato, Wheaton, Burdette, Holden, York, Gilbert, Grand, St. Lawrence, Pearl, Hulbert, Rose Hill, Hiland, Spring Lake and Bates. Voters in Commissioner District 1 shall vote at the home of Doug Schiltz, located just west of the village of Vayland on 369th Avenue, just south of the railroad tracks.

Commissioner District 2 includes the area east of SD HWY 45 (Broadway Avenue) beginning at 9th Street North and south along the centerline of the roadway to 4th Street SW, then east along the meandering city limits to the intersection of East 2nd Street and East 7th Avenue, then north along the centerline of East 7th Avenue to the alley north of East 7th Street, then following the city limit to East 4th Avenue, then north by street or open field to what would be East 9th Street if it extended east of East 3rd Avenue, all of which lies within the present city limits of the City of Miller. Voters in Commissioner District 2 shall vote in the Miller Community Center gymnasium.

Commissioner District 3 includes the area west of SD HWY 45 (Broadway Avenue) beginning at 4th Street SW, and meandering along the city limits to just west of 1st Street SW near 3rd Avenue West, then west along the railroad tract following the city limits to what would be 11th Avenue West if it existed, then returning east to the city limits which roughly follows the meandering of Ree Creek until it reaches West 7th Street. From the Ree Creek on West 7th Street, it includes the annexed properties addressed along said street, then from a point north of West 7th Street and west of Ree Creek, it returns to follow the meandering of Ree Creek to 14th Street West (US HWY 14), then east to SD HWY 45 (North Broadway Avenue), then north along the centerline of SD HWY 45 to north city limit line north of what is presently the industrial park. To the East of SD HWY 45 (Broadway Avenue), District 3 also includes the area north of the alley which runs parallel to East 9th Street to a point approximately one block east of East 3rd Avenue, then runs north following the city limits to and around the Vista Drive development back to East 3rd Avenue, then north to and around the former SD-DOT (now Hand County) shop complex, then returns to East 3rd Avenue, then north to the north city limit which runs along the north edge of the industrial park lots, and returns to SD HWY 45 (Broadway Avenue). Voters in Commissioner District 3 vote in the Miller Community Center gymnasium.


Commissioner District 4 includes the townships of Spring Hill, Rockdale, Logan, Ohio, Glendale, Cedar, Como, Mondamin, Pleasant Valley and that portion of Miller Township which does not include Commissioner

Districts 2 and 3 as stated previously. Voters in Commissioner District 4 shall vote at the Sunshine Bible Academy east gymnasium.

Commissioner District 5 includes the townships of Harrison, Spring, Park, Linn, Howell, Fairview, Ontario, Campbell, Alden, Florence, Alpha, Greenleaf, Riverside, Ree Heights, and Midland. Voters in Commissioner District 5 shall vote at the former Polo school gymnasium.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that should Hand County adopt the use of live poll books, where each precinct and precinct polling place has live access to the voter registry list, that a voter will then be able to vote in or at any of the polling places so mentioned, irrespective of the precinct in which they currently are registered.
